Registered Volunteer Program: The Fair Credit Reporting Act Notification

You are being asked to participate in the United States Bowling Congress Registered Volunteer Program.

The USBC Registered Volunteer Program complies with the Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA), which provides specific protections to all USBC volunteers who register with the National Center for Safety Initiatives for the purpose of submitting to a criminal back-

ground screening: Under the FCRA, an applicant is entitled to:

- Obtain a copy of his/her criminal history information.
- Challenge the accuracy and completeness of the criminal history information.

The FCRA also clearly establishes how criminal history records used during an appeal process and subsequent determinations must remain

confidential.

Requesting, obtaining or disseminating an applicant's confidential information for any other purpose may subject an offender to criminal penalties under federal and/or state law, as well as civil liability for defamation.

This FCRA notification does not mean USBC or NCSI are looking into a volunteer's personal credit history. The

USBC Registered Volunteer Program does not involve any kind of financial credit check.
